<u>Five Prizes of \$100 each</u> will be awarded for the best essays submitted by students of Lao heritage narrating in text (and images, if desired) the story of how their families fled Laos and arrived as refugees in the Elgin-Rockford area and struggled to make a new life here.



Four levels of awards will be made:

1-college, 2-high school, 1-middle school, 1-elementary school.

<u>Requirements</u>: Essays should be at least five pages in length. They may include photos or art work. They should be based on interviews or conversations with family members who fled Laos after 1975 and eventually settled in the Elgin-Rockford area. The essays do not necessarily need to identify family members by name, but details of age, place of birth, education, means of making a living, reasons for leaving and difficulties encountered in fleeing and starting a new life in the U.S. will help the reader understand your family's history.

<u>Deadline, Judging and Awards Ceremony</u>: The essays will be judged by an independent panel of professors from Northern Illinois University Center for Southeast Asian Studies. The deadline for submission is November 1, 2013. Awards will be made on November 10, 2013 at the Gail Borden Public Library in Elgin as part of "The Big Read" project.
